**Brother Knights**

As field agent I have a unique perspective in regard to the direction and performance of several Councils. I see councils that are on the rise and those that are on the decline. What makes the difference? It's not as much as you think. There are many kinds of Knights that make up a Council. I group them into several categories that include "dedicated knights", "supportive knights", "shadow knights" and

"prior knights. Every council has its group of "dedicated knights". These are the guys who hold offices, chair committees and generally show up anytime a need becomes evident. They work hard and generally keep the council functional. The second group, "supportive knights" is the backbone of the council. These are the guys who sit through meetings, provide manpower when the council calls and provide the future leadership of the council. The third group, "shadow knights" are also active...actively heading for separation from the Council and the K of C. They may like the order, but not enough to miss a TV program or a golf date to support a K of C activity. For some "shadow knights", the only interest in the council is maintaining K of C insurance. "Prior knights" take two forms. Those who have resigned and those who are on the rolls but have lost all interest in the K of C.

Every council has a mix of these members. Councils that are thriving usually have a solid group of "supportive knights." Councils that are declining have too many "shadow knights" and too few "supportive knights." The remarkable thing is that it only takes a small shift in percentages from "supportive" to "shadow" to put a Council in decline and a small shift in the opposite direction to make a Council successful. ***As we begin a new fraternal year with new officers who are dedicated to taking your Council in the right direction, each one of us has a choice to make. What kind of Knight do we want to be? What kind of Council do we want to have? The newly installed officers of your council need "supportive knights." Make a commitment. Make a difference. Make this the best year ever for your Council.***

**Living Wills Can Be Deadly**

Please rethink your "living will"!! Living wills are dangerous because they utilize vague terms without defining them. For example, many assume an attending physician is the family doctor. In reality, it is the doctor assigned to your case and can be a total disaster. They are **dishonest** because they use terms everyday people may not understand.

When someone reads "medically and surgically implanted tubes," they may not understand this can be as simple as an IV in the arm. Did you know that food and water are considered extraordinary means? You can be starved to death and it is all legal. A living will is **dangerous** because it can kill you against your will. We strongly urge you to discard your Living Will and replace it with a Will to Live. **The Will to Live** is the legal alternative to the South Carolina Living Will and is available from South Carolina Citizens for Life or can be easily downloaded at <http://www.nrlc.org>. **Pro-Life Makes Headways**

A May 4 Harris poll found that support for abortion has dropped below 50% for the first time in 30 years. It also showed that 44% of Americans said they would support a law in their own state like South Dakota's, banning all abortions except to save the mother's life. An earlier survey found that 54% support limiting legal abortion to the extreme circumstances of rape, incest, and to save the life of the mother. This is encouraging and definitely shows that we are making an impact. Stay the course, Brothers! (Incidentally, we disagree with the rape, incest, etc. exception; ALL abortions are wrong. Pregnancy under these circumstances are a tragedy, but to abort/kill the innocent baby would be murder.)

**Unborn Victims of Violence Act**

Please ask every Council member to contact their state representative by phone or e-mail and urge him to pass the Unborn Victims of Violence Act of 2006 (S1084) with no amendments. We are closer than we ever have been since 1998 to passing the unborn victims bill, but time is quickly running out. The legislative session ends June 1.



Opposition to die Unborn Victims of Violence bill is intense and well organized. Our House members are being flooded with calls and emails from opponents of the bill. *The Emblem of the Order* dates from the Second Supreme meeting, May 12, 1883, when it was designed by *James T. Mullen*, who was then the first Supreme Knight. A quick glance at the Emblem indicates a shield mounted upon a cross similar to a Maltese cross, turned sideways. The shield is that associated with a medieval Knight. The cross of Malta is the representation, in a traditionally artistic design, of the Cross of Christ through which all graces of redemption were procured for mankind. This, then, represents the Catholic spirit of the Order.

Mounted on the shield are three objects; a mace standing vertically, and crossed behind it, an anchor and a dagger or short sword. The mace from Roman days of authority, which must exist in any tightly-bonded and efficiently operating organization. The anchor is the mariner's symbol for Columbus, patron of the Order, while the short sword or dagger was the weapon of the Knight when engaged upon an errand of mercy.

Thus the shield expresses Catholic Knight-hood in organized merciful action, and with the letters K. of C., it proclaims this specific form of activity. The *red, white, and blue* in the background of the shield and the foreground of the *Cross of Malta* are the colors of our beloved country As such, red is the color of stout-hearted courage, of pulsing activity and a full measure of devotion. Blue is the symbol of hope, of calm tranquility under God, and of confidence in the protection of our country, established under God. White is the symbol of nobility of purpose, of purity of aim, and of crucible-tried ideals to be carried out.

## **Faith, Hope, Charity**

But there is another symbolism of color in red, white, and blue. This is the ecclesiastical symbolism in which red becomes the reflection of the drops of Christ's redemptive blood, shed upon Calvary, and of the Martyr's blood shed in defense of the faith. Red, then, is the symbol of Faith, of belief in Christ, in the Redemption, and in the mission of every man to spread the knowledge and love of Jesus Christ.

**White** is the color of the Eucharistic Host, pledge of God's Eucharistic presence among men, of the infinite love God had for man, and of the

overwhelming affection which the God-man had for each individual. **White** then is the symbol of Christ-like Charity.

**Blue** is the color of Our Lady's mantle, in which she draped her beloved Son, through Whom salvation came to a sinful world. **Blue** is then the symbol of Hope.

Brothers, be thus edified of the meaning of this, the Noble Emblem of Our Order. Always wear it with **Pride, Dignity and Honor**, and be inspired to live the virtues it proclaims

**Charles Carroll lone Catholic to sign Declaration of Independence  
July 4, 1776**

Fifty-six men signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, at the State House in Philadelphia. This body of delegates, called the Continental Congress, had formed two years earlier to speak and act for the people of the 13 British North American colonies which became the United States of America.

The Continental Congress had voted to declare the colonies "to be free and independent states," no longer under the thumb of Great Britain. To announce this to the world, they wrote and printed the document, which measured approximately 30 x 24 inches.

Four Maryland representatives signed the declaration: *Charles Carroll, Samuel Chase, Thomas Stone* and *William Paca*. Carroll was the only Roman Catholic of the 56. At the time he was elected to represent the state (but excluded as an official delegate because of his faith), he was too late to vote for the declaration's contents.

*Charles Carroll* of Carrollton was born 1737 into a wealthy Roman Catholic family in Annapolis. A refined gentleman with the education and experience expected of members of the finest courts in Europe, he cracked the ban on Catholics holding public office with his 1775 appointment to Maryland's first Council of Safety. He single-handedly ended decades of discrimination against Catholics and made himself one of the more important leaders of

Maryland's independence movement. In 1781 he was elected to the Maryland Senate.

Carroll's Annapolis house was the site of Maryland's official celebration for peace and independence in 1783. He died in 1832 at the age of 96, the last survivor of the signers of the declaration.

According to the National Archives, this large piece of parchment paper was rolled up for storage. A notation was written on the back at the bottom, upside down: "Original Declaration of Independence dated 4th July 1776." The original is exhibited in the Rotunda for the Charters of Freedom in Washington. Poor preservation techniques of the 19th century caused the document to fade badly.

Twenty-four copies are known to exist, two of which are in the Library of Congress. One of these was General *George Washington's* personal copy, sent to him by *John Hancock*, President of the Continental Congress with the instructions, "You will have it proclaimed at the Head of the Army." Washington read the declaration to his troops on July 9, 1776, in New York where they awaited the combined British fleet and army.

### **Knights Set New Annual Record of \$139 million for Charity**

#### **Hurricane Relief Tops Charitable Initiatives in 2005**

Led by a massive response to the hurricanes that devastated the southern United States, the Knights of Columbus announced today that it set new records for charitable giving and volunteer service hours in 2005.

The results of the Order's annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for the year ending Dec. 31, 2005, show that total contributions to charity at all levels reached \$139,711,619 – exceeding the previous year's total by nearly \$4 million. The figure includes \$33,638,426 donated by the Supreme Council, \$12,685,401 given by state councils, and \$93,387,792 in charitable donations from local councils, Fourth Degree assemblies, and Squire circles.

The survey also shows that the reported number of volunteer hours by Knights for charitable causes grew to

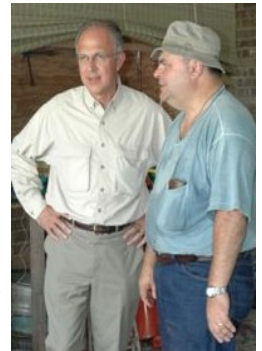
64,039,706 hours, up nearly 1 million hours from 2004. Additionally, members contributed another 8.5 million hours to fraternal service activity. There were 399,264 Knights of Columbus blood donors during the year, and Knights made more than 5.4 million visits to the sick and bereaved.

Many of the monetary donations and hours of service were in support of relief efforts along the Gulf Coast in the wake of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. The Knights response to the tragic storms was swift and significant. Disbursements of an initial \$2.5 million allocation for storm relief began two days after Hurricane Katrina struck New Orleans, and a dollar-for-dollar match was established for donations provided by its members.

Knights from across the United States and Canada traveled to the storm-damaged region to assist in clean-up and recovery initiatives. Local councils also provided meals and the use of their facilities to rescue crews and victims in the weeks following the hurricanes.

Cumulative figures show that during the past decade, the Knights of Columbus has donated more than \$1.208 billion to charity, and provided in excess of 574 million hours of volunteer service in support of charitable causes
