Our Lady of the Rosary

Feast Day October 7th

"You have invoked me by various titles and have always obtained favor from me. Now, since you have called me by that title so pleasing to me, 'Queen of the Holy Rosary,' I can no longer refuse the favor that you ask: for this name is most precious and dear to me."



These words were spoken by Our Blessed Mother in 1884 in an approved apparition of Our Lady which occurred in Naples. It was in the house of Commander Agrelli where Our Heavenly Mother deigned to make known the manner in which she loves to be invoked. For 13 months Fortuna Agrelli, the daughter of the Commander, had endured dreadful sufferings and tortuous cramps. She had been given up by the most celebrated physicians. On Feb. 16, 1884, the afflicted girl and her relatives began a novena of Rosaries.

The Queen of the Holy Rosary favored Fortuna with an apparition on March 3rd. Mary, sitting upon a high throne, surrounded by luminous figures, held the divine Child on her lap, and in her hand a Rosary. The Virgin Mother and the Holy Infant were clad in gold-embroidered garments. They were accompanied by St. Dominic and St. Catherine of Sienna.

Mary looked upon the sufferer with maternal tenderness. The patient saluted her with the words: "Queen of the Holy Rosary, be gracious to me; restore me to health." It was on this occasion that the Mother of God made known the manner in which she loves to be invoked, and the title she holds as precious and dear to her: "Queen of the Holy Rosary."

At Fatima, each time Our Lady appeared in 1917 she said, "Pray the Rosary every day." She promised to give her name in October when she would perform a miracle so that all may believe. And when she performed the miracle of the spinning of the sun - a miracle foretold months in advance as to the exact hour and day - it was witnessed by upwards to 100,000 people. Our Lady then gave us her name. She said, "I am the Lady of the Rosary. Continue to say the Rosary every day."

Our Lady appeared to Fortuna Agrelli again and said, "Whoever desires to obtain favors from Me should make three novenas of the prayers of the Rosary, and three novenas in thanksgiving." The Novena consists of praying five decades of the Rosary each day for twenty-seven days in petition, then immediately five decades each day for twenty-seven days in thanksgiving, whether or not the request has been granted. On the first day meditate on the Joyful Mysteries, on the second day the Sorrowful Mysteries, on the third day the Glorious Mysteries, on the fourth day meditate again on the Joyful Mysteries and continue thus throughout the fifty-four days.

Meet Seminarian Javier Heredia

Supporting priestly and religious vocations is a top priority of the Knights of Columbus. For the past several years our Council has been donating \$500 to seminarian, Javier Heredia, who our Council has "adopted". This disbursement of council funds is budgeted each year and is intended to aid the seminarian with his expenses as he makes the journey to priesthood.

At our July business meeting, our Council voted to "adopt" a second seminarian, Filip Wodecki. From this point on until Javier and Filip are ordained, our council will contribute \$500 annually to each of them.

"Serving people brings me true happiness"

Seminarian Javier Heredia's long road to priesthood.

The road to priesthood can be long and winding. Few understand this as well as Diocese of Charleston seminarian Javier Heredia. Originally a native of Juarez, Mexico, the 36 year-old first joined the seminary in 1993. Since that time Heredia has faced a good deal of adversity but the plan set forth at the age of 19 has never wavered.

"Unfortunately, after a year, I had to leave seminary formation for financial reasons, Heredia said. The hiatus stretched all the way to 2004. In the meantime Heredia moved to the United States, eventually settling down in the Johnston/Batesburg area.

"During my time living in South Carolina I never gave up the idea of being a priest," said Javier. "On the weekends I served in my parish, St. John of the Cross in Batesburg. There my pastor, Fr. Filemon Juya, kindly walked with me in my discernment while I was getting ready to go back to formation."

With the help of some great spiritual advisors like Fr. Juya, Javier flourished in the Charleston diocese. "I was very involved in the community, especially on matters related to Hispanic ministry," he said. "I served as a lector, altar server, in religious education, ministry of the sick, and Eucharistic ministry. I also had the honor to serve as a master of ceremony assistant when our former Bishop Baker visited our parish. It was my pastor who told the bishop of my desire to go back to seminary. Bishop Baker always cared for me and encouraged me to pray for discernment, which I certainly did with the help of my pastor."

Currently Javier is attending a Miami college seminary. He is nearing graduation and will soon be moving to a major seminary. The seminary itself has been everything he has hoped for and more. "It is more than academics," Javier explained. "Seminary is a precious time that God gives us to dwell in him in a very special and intimate way. Many times we do not know ourselves and formation provides a balanced lifestyle to help you respond honestly."

"I do not think that God calls men who are prepared to be priests," he continued. "I know that He prepares those

whom He calls. It is easy to discern God's call for marriage, but the only way to discern the call to be a priest is to enter the seminary."

With about four years to go in the seminary, Javier looks forward to everything God has in store for him. "I have had my ups and downs in my spiritual life," he said, "which I consider normal. However, serving the people of God in my parish, as well as during mission experiences, and being close to wonderful priests plus the priests I live with here in the seminary, has helped me to root my vocation in healthy discernment. I am convinced that serving people brings me true happiness, not in the worldly sense of enjoyment, but in the fullness of life that only God can provide."

How is it possible, in this 'day and age' to have the extraordinary numbers of vocations to priesthood and the religious life worldwide, but specifically for this purpose, here in the USA? It would seem most unlikely, considering societal norms at this time.

Obviously, the fact that we have been praying as a church over decades for these particular vocations, is one answer. However, another answer would be the two 'giants' who walked the world stage and modeled faithful and faith filled lives, for all the world to see, through priesthood and religious life: Pope John Paul II and Mother Theresa, respectively.

We all know and understand the impact they had on us; maybe we even know about the impact they had on youth, but have we stopped to think about the Grace that is pouring from Heaven unto the church they served and loved so, even now?
